It is believed to be a cross between early and late flowering forms (possibly A. rupicola & A. hupehensis), and the result is a plant which flowers from May to November. Each pure white petal has a distinct grey-blue streak along the reverse, so when in bud, or when the flowers nod and half close (in the mornings and evenings) the flowers look bluish, but when they are fully open they are a dazzling pure white. <u>Pruning Group 1:</u> These plants flower on growth produced the previous year and, if needed, are just given a light pruning to remove spent flowers immediately after flowering. Old, woody plants can be pruned very hard – down to a couple of feet if necessary, preferably to just above some strong healthy growth – after flowering – to remove lots of the old non flowering growth. Plants make take a year or so to fully recover and start flowering properly again. Very old plants may never recover!	
<u>Pruning Group 2:</u> These cultivars can be cut back fairly hard – say to between 90cm to 1.2m high – to just above a fat pair of buds/single bud, the former is better. Start pruning at the top of the plant and work your way down. Pruning is carried out at the end of February/early March	
<u>Pruning Group 3:</u> these can be cut back very hard – say to 23-45cm high – again just above a pair of buds/single bud – removing nearly all the previous years growth. Start pruning at the bottom of the plant. Pruning is carried out at the end of February/early March.
